

# 100 years of 4-H

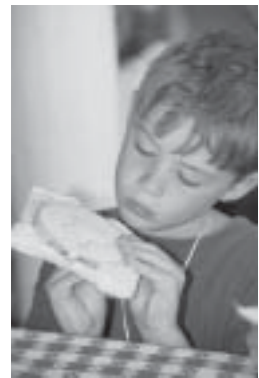
4-H Club in Fairmount, Indiana, drew a Garfield Print celebrating 100 Years of 4-H (1902-2002). The print features comic strip character Garfield and the 4-H Pledge. A total of 54 numbered prints were produced and hand-signed. Each print was sold on EBay to benefit a different State 4-H Foundation each week. The Wyoming print sold during the week of the Wyoming State Fair and brought the second highest price of the 54 prints. Proceeds from this sale allowed the Wyoming State 4-H Foundation to purchase the Utah print, which proudly hangs in the State 4-H Office.

The history of the Wyoming 4-H program is filled with tremendous success stories and accomplishments. As we start a new century of 4-H, we begin the process of focusing toward our future. The Wyoming State 4-H Foundation will conduct a strategic planning process for the foundation during 2002-2003. The resulting plan will position the foundation to become one of the 10 largest State 4-H Foundations in the country. Ultimately, 4-H members and leaders from throughout Wyoming will benefit as the foundation provides greater scholarships and educational opportunities, while enhancing the club, community and county 4-H programs.

For the past three years, it has been my extreme pleasure to serve Wyoming 4-H as the Livestock, Equine, Poultry, and Rabbit Specialist. As I start my fourth year of service, it seems most appropriate to plan for the future by reflecting on the past and building on its successes.

The partnership between the Wyoming State 4-H Foundation and the Wyoming 4-H Staff has been an integral and extremely valuable part of this success. The 4-H Foundation has funded many awards, award trips, educational activities, and teaching materials which have greatly contributed to the growth of the 4-H Youth----and I say "thank-you" (both personally and professionally) for this support of the 4-H Youth of Wyoming. Without this support they would not be able to participate in these activities which promote their development into positive and productive adults.

As a result of your generous support, over the past three years, Wyoming 4-H Club Members have seen the addition of a Junior Meat Goat Show and a Junior Poultry Show at the Wyoming State Fair; been able to participate in the State 4-H Goat Symposium held in Riverton and the State 4-H Poultry Workshop held in Casper; place fifth at the 2001 National 4-H Livestock Judging Contest held in Kansas City; place second at the 2001 National 4-H Meats Judging Contest held in Kansas City; win the 2001 National 4-H Horse Judging Contest held in Denver; win the 2002 National 4-H Meats Judging Contest held in Louisville; as well as participate in many other activities held throughout the United States. Along with these activities; many videos, manuals, and other materials have been supplied to each county for use in the education of their 4-H Youth. Therefore, your funds are reaching more than just the youth who win trips and awards---they are used for our most important mission of educating youth. As a result, your generous donations are reaching more and more youth at the County, State, and National 4-H Level.

So, what are the plans for the future? Many requests have been received to repeat the Goat Symposium and the Poultry Workshop, so these requests will be honored over the next year or two. Also, given the success of these events, similar activities relating to the other animal species are being planned. Videos, manuals, and other materials will continue to be supplied to the county offices for utilization in the educational activities conducted within the county. A 4-H Livestock Website is currently being designed— however (like the nine new introductory project manuals), this undertaking will take two to three years to complete.

It is hoped that the events of the past, the plans for the future, and the positive relationship between the Wyoming State 4-H Foundation and the Wyoming 4-H Staff will blend together to continue the 4-H tradition of building positive and productive adults----by Making the Best, Better. Again, "thank-you" for your time, support, and generosity.

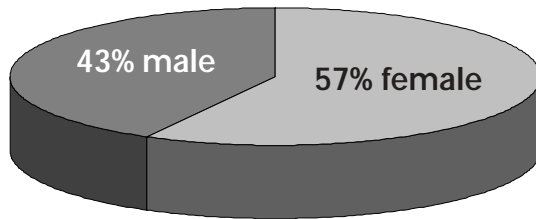

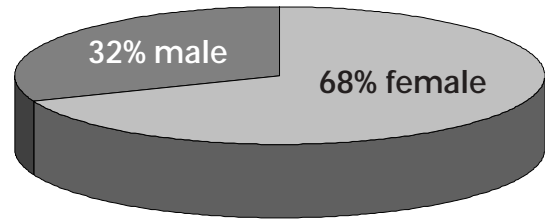
## 2001-2002 4-H enrollment

Wyoming 4-H members



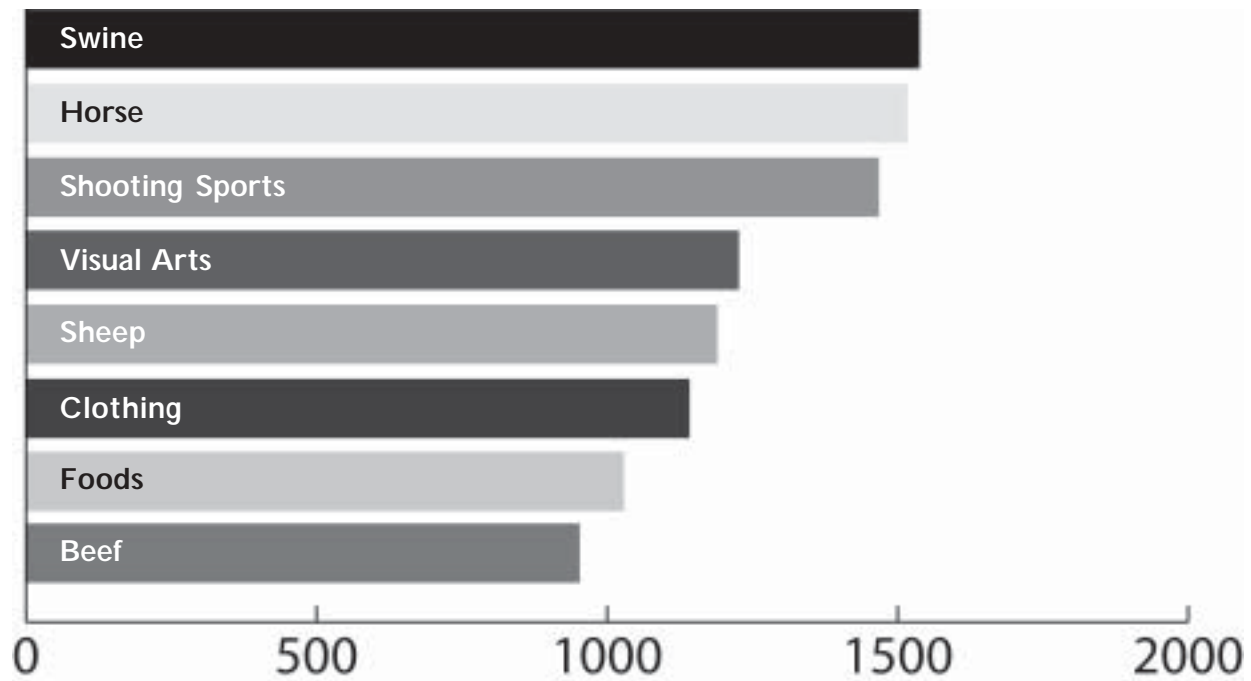

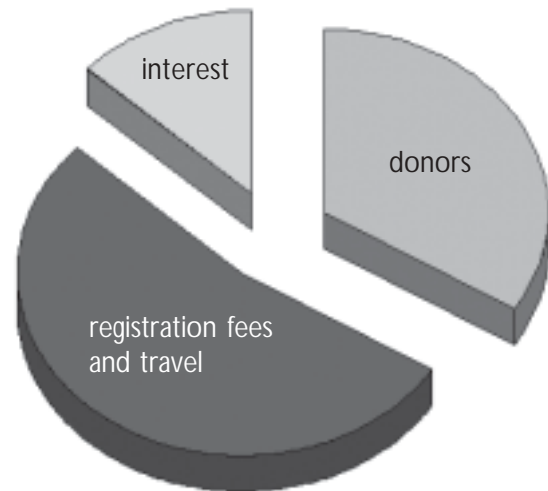
