

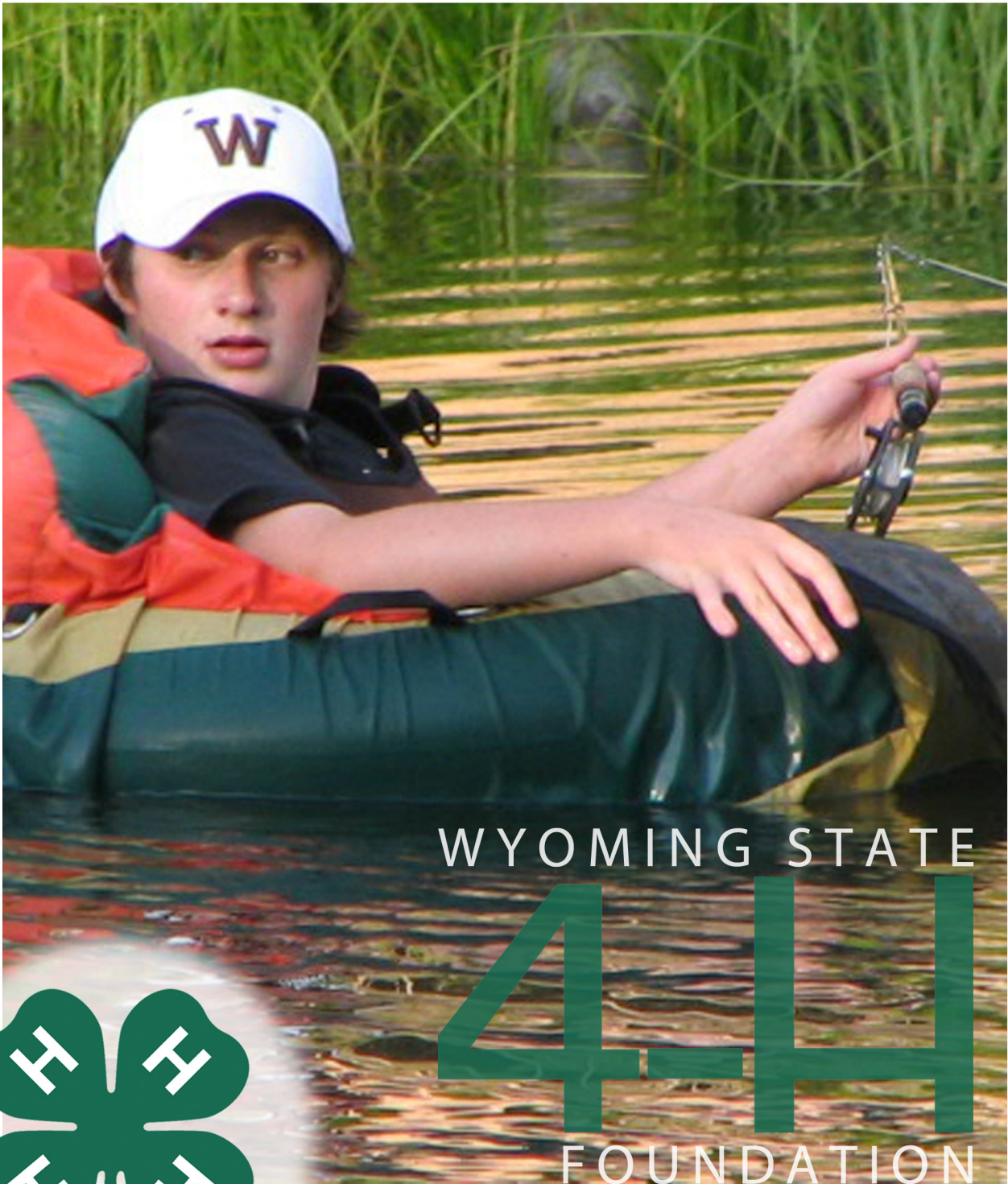


Wyoming 4-H Ethics Statement

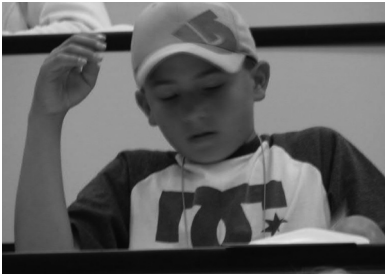
Expenses of the Wyoming State 4-H Foundation

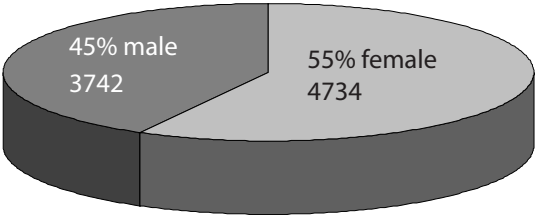

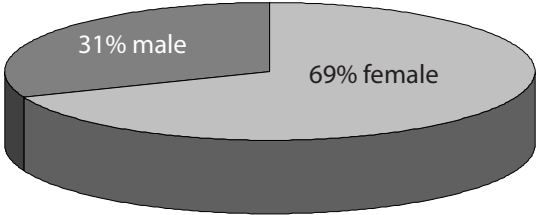
## 2005–2006 4-H enrollment

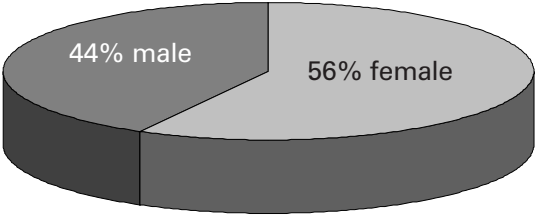
Wyoming 4-H leaders

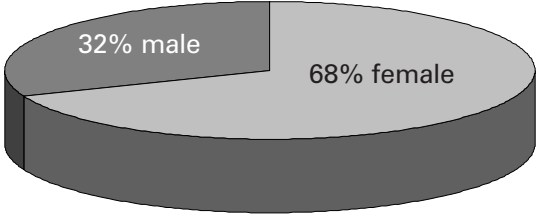
## 2004–2005 4-H enrollment

Wyoming 4-H traditional club members



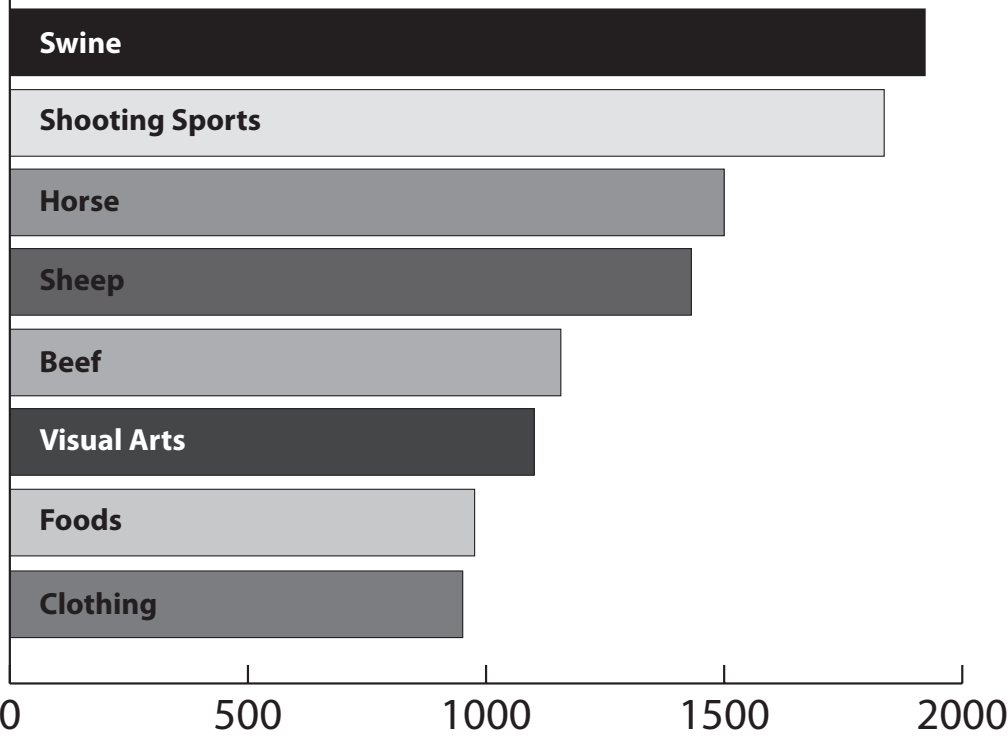

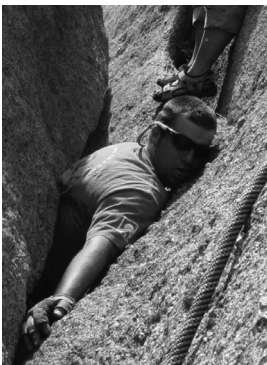

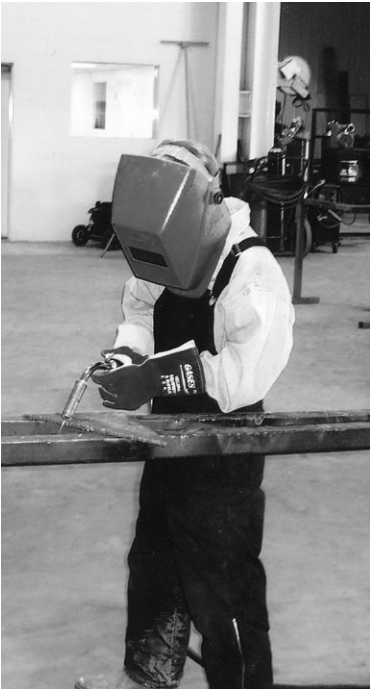
