Horse 101

- All 4-H members and exhibitors participating in 4-H Horse Events in Crook County, including 4-H practices, 4-H clinics, and 4-H shows must be safety certified and endorsed by a certified 4-H Horse leader designated by the Crook County 4-H Office. Please contact the 4-H office to obtain a list of certified horse leaders.
- Horse Safety Certifications must be completed by the Thursday before the Crook County Fair Horse Show.
- One safety certification form needs to be completed for each horse a youth intends to learn and compete with.
- The 4-H Educator, Horse Superintendent, and/or a Certified Horse Leader may ask a member to re-certify at anytime if there is a safety concern with the member or the member's horse.

Crook County 4-H members must be enrolled in 4-H and have paid their enrollment fee, as well as be registered in horse on ZSuite before completing horse safety certifications or participating in 4-H horse related activities.

Fair Entry & ZSuite DO NOT talk to each other! In order to enter into the Crook County Fair Horse Show, you must have an active 4-H enrollment, in the horse project, and submit fair entries via the fair entry website.
