



Showing 4-H Livestock in Crook County 101



- Each project member is allowed to sell only **3** market animals. An exhibitor may sell **2** market hogs to make a total of **3** animal. No other species will be allowed to sell more than one. A meat pen of 3 rabbits or poultry is considered 1 animal.
- Market Livestock (excluding poultry & rabbit) must be tagged with either an official USDA (Bains) tag by a vet or a county fair RFID tag.
- Market Beef must be tagged by February 1st (Mandatory In-person tagging dates announced by fairboard)
- Market Sheep/Goats/Swine must be tagged by June 1st (Mandatory In-person tagging dates announced by fairboard)
- Rate of Gain participants must be weighed in Sundance on the certified scale.
- All Futurity, Market & Breeding Livestock (rabbit & poultry included) require ownership paperwork - Due June 1st (Market Beef Ownership forms due February 1st)
- Ownership paperwork consists of: County Fair Ownership Form, Brand Inspections (Sheep & Beef), Scrapies Tag (Sheep & Goats), Bill of Sale and proof of 840 tag (if applicable)
- Animal must be designated either 4-H or FFA and can not be changed after tagging or breeding paperwork is submitted.
- Rabbits must be tattooed by July 1st
- Minimum Weights: Beef - 1,100lbs, Swine - 225 lbs, Sheep - 100lbs, Goat- 50lbs, Market Poultry 3.5lbs/ bird, Meat Rabbits - up to 80 days to weigh between 3-5lbs
- Youth Exhibiting animals at the Crook County Fair are expected to showcase their animals with pride and professionalism. All youth must dress for success, proper attire is required as the following nice dress shirts, nice pants (without holes), and boots or leather shoes. No tennis shoes or sandals. For FFA Showmanship you must follow FFA Official dress, which includes Official FFA Blue Jacket, White collared shirt or blouse, Official FFA tie or scarf, Black slacks or pants, black closed toes shoes or as stated by their FFA Advisor.

Crook County 4-H members must be enrolled in 4-H and have paid their enrollment fee, as well as be registered in their respective Livestock Project on ZSuite by the ownership deadlines.

Fair Entry & ZSuite DO NOT talk to each other! In order to enter into fair you must have an active 4-H enrollment and submit fair entries via the fair entry website.
