



# Crook County 4-H Shooting Sports



- All 4-H members and exhibitors participating in 4-H shooting sports events, practices, county shoot, and/or state shoot must have Active Status in Crook County 4-H.
- Members must be enrolled in their shooting sports discipline.
- Members will need to attend a safety meeting and sign the participation contract prior to practicing. (This will need to be completed 1x per 4-H Year.)
- Shooting Sports Members will need to pay an additional \$10 fee or participate in a minimum of 1 community service project that is scheduled by the shooting sports leaders & 4-H Educator.
- Members may bring their own equipment to be used but it will be checked for safety by a shooting sports leader before it is used.
- Only certified 4-H Shooting Sports Volunteers may be on the shooting line and assist members with firearms and equipment.
- The 4-H Educator and/or Shooting Sports leader may remove an individual that poses a safety concern at anytime and parents will be contacted.
- County Shoot is not affiliated with the Crook County Fair.
- Members may use county equipment to participate in 4-H state shoot. 4-H equipment will be transported to and from state shoot by the 4-H educator or designated shooting sports leader.
- Schedules for Shooting Sports are determined in the the fall.
- Shooting sports projects include: archery, air rifle, air pistol, .22 rifle, .22 pistol, shotgun, muzzleloader, and outdoor/hunting skills.
