



1. 4-H MEMBER - HOW TO FILL OUT AND USE THIS CERTIFICATE

- A. Fill out two forms for each horse, one for your records and one for the County Extension Office.
- B. Be sure all items are filled out correctly and necessary signatures are included on both copies.
- C. This certificate is valuable. Keep it in a safe place. It is a record of your project animal.
- D. You may be asked to present it at county, district or state 4-H horse events.
- E. At the end of the year, keep your copy in your record book as a permanent record.
- F. Check the Wyoming Junior Horse Show Rule Book for other ownership details.

2. The member shall own or lease the horse used in the 4-H Horse project. Any 4-H horse must fulfill the following requirements:

- A. **Owned Horse** - An owned horse should be identified by a 4-H I.D. sheet. Required sheets shall be completed and returned to the University Extension Office (in your county) by May 1 of the current year. Both the leader's (or parents for Lone Star members) and the agent's signatures are required on the I.D. sheet. Member should retain a copy of the I.D. sheet.
- B. **Family Horse** - A family horse can be identified and used by only one 4-H or FFA member in 4-H or FFA activities.
- C. **Leased Horse** - Any leased horse is to be leased for one full year and must be leased prior to May 1 of the current year.
 - (1) If using a leased horse, one copy of the State 4-H Horse Lease Agreement Form (including the 4-H Horse I.D. Certificate) will be kept on file at the University Extension Agent's Office. Member should retain a signed copy of the form. The agreement should be notarized.
- D. Whenever a question arises on horse identification, the 4-H member, along with the county, share the responsibility to provide proper proof of ownership.
- E. Any infractions as determined by a county grievance review committee or county 4-H horse committee will disqualify said horse during contract year for showing or competing in any county or state 4-H contest.
- F. A 4-H member can lease a (one) horse if he already owns a horse.
- G. A 4-H member cannot lease more than one horse under any circumstances.

3. MULTIPLE USE HORSES - One horse - one member. No other member can share any one horse with another 4-H or FFA member.

4. The deadline for ownership of an owned or leased horse is May 1.

4-H LEADER

At a club meeting early in the new calendar year, instruct 4-H members on how to fill out the certificates and the importance of animal identification. Ask 4-H members to give talks and demonstrations on animal identification and registration. Have 4-H members return completed forms at a later meeting in time for you to sign them and send them to the University Extension Agent for signature no later than May 1.

EXTENSION AGENT

Sign each certificate. File one copy for the county office, either alphabetically or by club. Return one copy to 4-H member by May 20. One copy should accompany the horse when exhibited. **DO NOT SEND** this certificate to the State 4-H Office.
