#### SERVICE PROJECT

#### Supplies Needed:

-comic strip template

-fine tip sharpie markers -candy bar -ink pads

-blank paper and pencil -scotch tape



#### Instructions:

- You will be creating a finger print cartoon strip.
- Finger print cartoon characters are created by taking your finger and placing it on an ink pad and then transferring it to a piece of paper. Depending on how large you want your cartoon determines which finger you should use. The easiest way to transfer the finger print is place the side of our finger on the ink pad and roll your finger until the tip is covered in intermediate.



- -On blank piece of paper practice creating your cartoon character and create the message for your comic strip "what will be included in each box"
- -Once you have a rough draft created, **complete the comic strip template that is on the attached page.**

If your club needs help getting the supplies for the project, please let me know and we are happy to gather them for you. Dawn would even come lead the activity at your club meeting, if you would like some help!



All youth planning on selling a market animal in the 4-H sale, is required to take Quality Assurance once in each 4-H age group they are registered in (once as a Junior 8-10, once as an Intermediate 11-13, and once as a Senior 14-18). Ages are based on the youth's 4-H age (age as of January 01, 2022). This includes both large and small market animal sellers.

Intermediates and Seniors who require QA will be taking an online course. The information for the course, along with the coupon code can be obtained from the office.

Juniors will need to complete a face-to-face class for the benefits of personal interactions with other youth in their project area, as well as getting to know the Educator.



# Washed vs. Unwashed Eggs

Washed eggs-Refrigerate or eat within 2 hours after washing, Good for 3 months refrigerated.

Unwashed eggs-Good for 3 weeks at room temperature or 3 months if refrigerated.

Washed or not, once eggs are refrigerated, they should not be kept out of the refrigerator for more than 2 hours. Why? Because a cold egg left out at room temperature can sweat, increasing the growth of bacteria in the egg.

When laying an egg, a hen's body deposits a natural protective coating on the outside of the shell, called the egg bloom. The bloom seals the shell pores, prevents bacteria from getting inside the shell, & reduces moisture loss from the egg-all making the egg last longer and increasing the time it remains fresh. Washing the egg removes the bloom.

Washed eggs won't taste as fresh as unwashed eggs of the same age.

Pid you know? Most of the world does not refrigerate their eggs. In the U.S. the average egg in the store is 8 weeks old.

### Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI)

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#### **HPAI** in Poultry:

What To Expect If You Suspect

Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) is a serious poultry disease that spreads very quickly. With this threat, it's more important than ever for you to keep strict biosecurity measures at your poultry operations and watch your birds closely for any signs of the disease. We need you to quickly report problems in your flocks and work with us to respond. Your help will be vital in protecting the U.S. poultry industry from this deadly disease. The faster we can respond and depopulate sick birds, the faster we can stop the virus

Be on the lookout for HPAI. Here's what to watch for, where to report, and what to expect from State and Federal responders if you have a susp

#### Know the Warning Signs

- · Sudden increase in bird deaths without any clinical signs
- · Lack of energy and appetite
- Decrease in egg production
- Soft- or thin-shelled or misshapen eggs
- · Swelling of the head, eyelids, comb, wattles, and hocks
- · Purple discoloration of the wattles, comb, and legs
- · Gasping for air (difficulty breathing)
- · Coughing, sneezing, and/or nasal discharge (runny nose)
- · Stumbling or falling down

If your birds are sick or dying, report it right away. This is one of the most important things you can do to keep HPAI from spreading. Call:

- Your flock or local veterinarian,
- The State veterinarian,
- The State animal health/poultry diagnostic laboratory, or

HPAI is a deadly disease for poultry. It can infect all types of chickens and turkeys, plus many other kinds of birds. HPAI can strike suddenly and spread fast. It is devastating for poultry industries.



#### What To Expect Next

After you report, a Federal or State animal health official will contact you to learn more about your flock and operation. If we suspect HPAI in your flock, response personnel will come to your operation quickly and work with you on the steps below

#### Sample Collection

A Federal or State animal health official will take samples from live birds, dead birds, and/or your barn for testing. The samples then go to the closest diagnostic laboratory, and you can expect initial results within 24 hours. Until unagrosses assoratory, any bot can expect initial results within 24 hours. Ontai the results come back, we consider your operation a suspect HPAI case. This means we work with you to put measures in place that guard against any further disease spread.

The State will quarantine your facility. Only authorized workers are allowed in and out of your property, and the movement of poultry, poultry products, and equipment is also restricted. This is to help make sure the virus, if present, does not keep spreading.

USDA will start working with you to inventory your poultry. If the laboratory confirms HPAI, this information helps us appraise your flock and provide the value of your depopulated birds. In order to receive indemnity, the owner or grower must certify that a biosecurity plan was in place prior to an HPAI detection. In 2016, APHIS issued an interim rule that allows for split payments between owners and contract growers. We will also offer a standard amount to cover costs for virus elimination activities at your operation (cleanup work).

#### If Your Flock Tests Positive for HPAI

If the test results are positive, a State or Federal veterinary medical officer (VMO) will notify you immediately. We will then assign a case manager who will be onsite to guide you through the next phase of the response and answer any questions you may have. Your case manager will work closely with you as we prepare to depopulate your flock and find out, as best we can, how HPAI may have entered your facility and if it has spread to any neighboring farms

Our goal is to depopulate your flock within 24 hours of first detecting HPAI. This 24-hour window is critical. By acting quickly, we can keep the virus from building up in the environment and spreading further. We have several depopulation methods we can use to meet the 24-hour goal and will work with you to figure out the best option.

#### FLOCK INVENTORY: WHAT INFO WILL I NEED?

To help speed the inventory process, you'll need to have the following

- Type of flock (turkey, chicken, layer breeder, backyard, etc.)
- Age, sex, and number of each type of bird
- Number of barns and number of birds in each barn
- Bird mortality records
- Onset date of disease signs (if

- Name of your facility/comptex
- Name of owner/manager

# Frow a Little Extra











**Direct Seeding:** Sow seeds directly into the garden as soon as soil can be worked in spring. Sow seeds 1" apart, ¼" deep. Germination can take 2-3 weeks. Thin young seedlings to 1-2" to increase root size. Harvest 6-7" long carrots by digging. **70 DAYS TO MATURITY.** 

Start Seeds Indoors: 3-4 weeks prior to transplanting outdoors. Transplant into the garden after last spring frost. Plant 18" apart in rows, and space rows 24-36" apart.

Direct Seeding: Sow seeds directly into the garden after last spring frost. Plant seeds 3-4" apart, ½" deep. Later, thin plants in the rows to 18" apart. Harvest mature cabbage heads when they reach 3½ pounds. 71 DAYS TO MATURITY.

**Direct Seeding:** Plant seeds directly into the garden after last frost and soil has warmed. Sow seeds 1" deep and 2-3" apart in a row. Space rows 24" apart. Harvest bean pods when they reach 5" in length. Harvest regularly to encourage new pods to grow for a continuous harvest.

50 DAYS TO MATURITY.

Start seeds Indoors: 3-4 weeks prior to transplanting outdoors. Transplant into the garden after last spring frost. Space plants 18" apart in the row, and space rows 24-36" apart.

Direct Seeding: Sow seeds directly into the garden after last spring frost. Plant seeds 3-4 inches apart, ½" deep, in rows 24-36" apart. Later, thin plants in the rows to 18" apart. Harvest when broccoli heads are 4" diameter, and before heads develop yellow flowers. 57 DAYS TO MATURITY.

**Start Seeds Indoors:** Start seeds indoors 3-4 weeks before transplanting outdoors. Harden plants off for 4-7 days before planting outdoors. Space plants 24" in the row, and space rows 6' apart. Harvest 3-5 pound squash using a knife or garden scissors to cut squash from vine prior to any hard frosts. **95 DAYS TO MATURITY.** 

**Direct Seeding:** Plant when soil is warm (70° F). Sow 2 seeds per foot, ½ inch deep. Space rows 6 feet apart. Thin to 12 inches apart. Harvest at 9-11 inches long. Harvest daily to maintain quality. **55 DAYS TO MATURITY.**
