

RABBIT PROJECT MEMBERS

**NOW THAT WE ARE GETTING WARMER WEATHER AGAIN,
REMEMBER TO KEEP YOUR RABBIT OUT OF THE SUN.**

A RABBIT CAN DIE VERY QUICKLY FROM OVERHEATING.

HERE ARE A FEW TIPS TO KEEP YOUR RABBIT COOL ON WARM DAYS.

- 1. TRY TO KEEP THEIR AREAS COOL. (FAN'S TO CIRCULATE THE AIR CAN HELP KEEP THE AREA COOLER)**
- 2. GIVE YOUR RABBITS FROZEN WATER BOTTLES (TO LIE NEXT TOO)**
- 3. PUT CERAMIC TILES IN THE FREEZER TO GET COLD THEN GIVE THEM TO YOUR RABBIT TO LAY ON.**
- 4. PUT ICE CUBES IN THEIR WATER**

ALWAYS MAKE SURE YOUR RABBIT HAS FRESH WATER DAILY.

POULTRY POINTERS

HELPFUL TIPS & REMINDERS FOR RAISING HAPPY, HEALTHY BIRDS

RAISING POULTRY CAN BE ONE OF THE MOST REWARDING 4-H PROJECTS OUT THERE. WHETHER YOU'RE JUST STARTING OUT WITH CHICKS OR MANAGING A FULL FLOCK, STAYING ON TOP OF BASIC CARE AND KNOWING WHAT TO WATCH FOR MAKES A BIG DIFFERENCE. HERE ARE SOME HELPFUL REMINDERS AND TIPS TO KEEP YOUR BIRDS HEALTHY, COMFORTABLE, AND SHOW-READY!

BASIC CARE & MAINTENANCE

1. CLEAN WATER DAILY:

ALWAYS PROVIDE CLEAN, FRESH WATER. POULTRY NEED ACCESS TO WATER AT ALL TIMES, ESPECIALLY DURING WARM WEATHER. CLEAN WATERERS REGULARLY TO PREVENT ALGAE AND BACTERIA BUILD-UP.

2. NUTRITIOUS FEED:

CHOOSE THE RIGHT FEED FOR YOUR BIRD'S AGE AND PURPOSE—STARTER FEED FOR CHICKS, GROWER FEED FOR PULLETS, AND LAYER FEED FOR HENS PRODUCING EGGS. ALWAYS STORE FEED IN A DRY, SEALED CONTAINER TO KEEP OUT PESTS AND MOISTURE.

3. CLEAN COOP = HAPPY BIRDS:

REGULARLY CLEAN THE COOP AND REPLACE BEDDING TO KEEP AMMONIA LEVELS DOWN AND PREVENT DISEASE. PINE SHAVINGS OR STRAW ARE GOOD BEDDING OPTIONS. A CLEAN ENVIRONMENT REDUCES STRESS AND HELPS KEEP YOUR FLOCK HEALTHY.

4. PROVIDE PLENTY OF SPACE:

OVERCROWDING LEADS TO STRESS, FIGHTING, AND DISEASE. AS A RULE OF THUMB, AIM FOR AT LEAST 2–3 SQUARE FEET PER BIRD INSIDE THE COOP AND 8–10 SQUARE FEET PER BIRD IN THE OUTDOOR RUN.

TIPS FOR DEALING WITH MITES

1. DUST BATHS:

MITES HATE DUST! ALLOWING BIRDS ACCESS TO A DRY, SANDY AREA WHERE THEY CAN DUST BATHE IS ONE OF THE BEST NATURAL DEFENSES.

2. REGULAR INSPECTIONS:

CHECK UNDER THE WINGS AND AROUND THE VENT AREA WEEKLY FOR TINY CRAWLING INSECTS OR RED SPOTS ON THE SKIN.

3. COOP TREATMENT:

USE POULTRY-SAFE MITE POWDERS OR SPRAYS AND APPLY THEM IN NESTING BOXES, ROOSTING AREAS, AND ANY CRACKS OR CREVICES. DIATOMACEOUS EARTH IS A NATURAL OPTION THAT WORKS WELL TOO.

4. TREAT THE WHOLE FLOCK:

IF ONE BIRD HAS MITES, ASSUME THEY ALL DO. TREAT THE ENTIRE FLOCK AND REPEAT IN 7–10 DAYS TO CATCH ANY NEWLY HATCHED MITES

KEEP A POULTRY CARE CALENDAR FOR FEED SCHEDULES, CLEANING DAYS, HEALTH CHECKS, AND SHOW PREP.

TALK WITH YOUR 4-H LEADER OR LOCAL EXTENSION OFFICE IF YOU EVER HAVE QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS—IT'S ALWAYS BETTER TO ASK EARLY THAN TREAT LATE!

Our Mission

The Laramie County 4-H Shooting Sports program is dedicated to educating youth in the safe and responsible use of firearms and archery equipment while fostering leadership, sportsmanship, and personal growth. Through hands-on learning and mentorship, we aim to instill confidence, discipline, and respect for others and the environment. Our program upholds all Wyoming 4-H Shooting Sports rules and safety standards to ensure a structured and ethical learning environment. By emphasizing safety, skill development, and positive youth development, we empower participants to become responsible citizens and lifelong enthusiasts of shooting sports.

Sign-in Change

- To support our shooters in building their skills and staying engaged, we're introducing practice cards! Each shooter will receive a practice card to be stamped at every practice they attend.
 - **Pistol:** If participating in both air pistol and .22 pistol, members will need a total of 4 combined practices. If only shooting either air pistol OR .22 pistol, members will need to attend 3 practices.
 - **Rifle:** Similar to pistol, members shooting both air rifle and .22 rifle will need a total of 4 combined practices
 - **Shotgun & Archery:** Members will need to attend 3 practices for shotgun and 3 for archery.
- Practice cards should be completed and returned to the Extension Office before county shoot. We appreciate everyone's dedication and look forward to another great season!
- Practice cards will be handed out at orientations. We understand that orientations have already begun, so if you have not received your card yet please reach out to us at the extension office: (307)633-4383 or 1400 E College Drive, Pathfinder #406, Cheyenne.
- Members are responsible for their own practice cards and must get them stamped at each practice they attend.
- If your card is lost, you can pick up a new one at the extension office.
- **Helpful Tip:** Take a picture of your card after every practice in case you lose it!

We hope this message finds you well. We wanted to address some recent confusion regarding the Youth Quality Assurance classes for this year.

Please note that there will be no in-person YQA classes offered this year. All required training will be conducted entirely online, and this applies to all age groups. We understand that this is a shift from previous years, and we appreciate your flexibility as we continue to prioritize accessibility and consistency in our programming.

As a reminder, all 4-H youth planning to sell an animal at fair must complete the YQA certification that corresponds with their current age division. As youth get older or join 4-H for the first time, they are required to complete the next level of YQA training appropriate for their age.

Step-by-step instructions on how to access the online training are shown below. Please contact the Extension Office for your access code and reach out to us with any questions you may have!







FFA & Independent Steps

The email entered for a member that is 12 or younger must be that of a parent or guardian


