What is Positive youth Development, and why is 4-H different than other programs?



Positive youth development occurs from an intentional process that promotes positive outcomes for young people by providing opportunities, relationships and the support to fully participate.

~U.S. Department of Health & Human Services

The basic purpose of the 4-H program is to focus on the personal growth of youth. The organization provides a number of opportunities in areas such as communications, leadership, career development, livestock, home improvement, and computer technology. 4-H members learn from others, learn new life skills, and set and achieve goals. Each educational experience emphasizes self esteem, communication, and decision making (Gerdes and Clover 2001).

In many of my experiences I have learned that by not only teaching, but also allowing youth the opportunity to put what they have learned in the classroom to practice, youth are able to better understand, and remember what they have learned. It also allows them to explore things they are curious about, and to try new things. Likewise by fulfilling leadership positions in their club, they are able to develop leadership skills and help push each other to become the best people they can be.

By creating opportunities for youth to learn and master skills, experiential education meets fundamental needs in youth development. Coupled with the sense of belonging that is created within the club aspect, youth are able to hone in on their leadership skills themselves.
