


You should now be directed to the **Dashboard** screen.

- 1.To add members, in the black drop down menu, select household members.
- 2. On the next screen, select + HOUSEHOLD MEMBER
- 3. Fill in the required fields for one of your members.
- 4. Don't forget to add a club! Click
- 5. You will also need to select projects for each club by clicking **ADD PROJECT** then selecting a project from the drop down menu
- 5. Finish by clicking

You will return to the **Household Members** screen. The member you added should appear in the list along with yourself. Repeat this process for the other members of your household.



- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).

ANIMAL AGE & MEAT QUALITY

Many factors contribute to carcass quality such as management, genetics, nutrition, and age.

As animals age, their muscles have more connective tissue and collagen. This makes the meat tougher. Some of the connective tissue is heat stable, so even as the meat is cooked, the connective tissue remains tough.

YOUTH QUALITY ASSURANCE (YQA) TEACHES YOUTH HOW TO GIVE THE BEST CARE FOR THEIR LIVESTOCK IN ORDER TO PRODUCE A HIGH QUALITY PRODUCT FOR CONSUMERS. THIS IS LEARNED THROUGH UNDERSTANDING THE IMPORTANCE PROPER NUTRITION, HOUSING, IDENTIFICATION, HANDLING, CARCASS QUALITY, HEALTH CARE, WITHDRAWAL TIMES, AND RECORD KEEPING.

ALL YOUTH PLANNING TO SELL A MARKET PROJECT MUST COMPLETE YQA. IF MEMBERS HAVE GONE THROUGH PORK CHECK OFF (PQA) OR HAVE COMPLETED THE BEEF QUALITY ASSURANCE (BQA) OR HAVE ANOTHER QUALITY ASSURANCE CERTIFICATION, THAT WILL MEET YOUR REQUIREMENTS.

IF YOU WOULD PREFER TO TEST OUT OF YQA, AN AGE AND SPECIES APPROPRIATE TEST MAY BE TAKEN AT EITHER EXTENSION OFFICE. YOUTH MUST SCORE AN 80% OR HIGHER, AND CAN RETAKE THE TEST (ON A DIFFERENT DAY) AS MANY TIMES AS THEY WOULD LIKE. MEMBERS SCORING 100% (ON THE SENIOR LEVEL TEST) WILL NO LONGER NEED TO COMPLETE YQA IN FUTURE YEARS. JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATES SCORING 100% WILL NOT NEED TO COMPLETE YQA AGAIN UNTIL THEY REACH A NEW AGE LEVEL. HERE IS A STUDY GUIDE FOR THE TESTS! STUDY-GUIDE

Park County 4-H has switched to a staggered enrollment fee which started in October 2019.

All payments can be made through ZSuite when enrolling or by check or cash. The goal of this change is to help encourage returning members to re-enroll and pay their dues before they participate in any 4-H events. Our office will send out an invoice to each family this fall to help make the transition easier.

The 2021-2022 enrollment fees will be as follows: \$15.00 October 1, 2021-December 31, 2021 **\$30.00 January 1, 2022-September 30, 2022** (if you have not paid your dues for the 2021-2022 year) There will still be an additional \$50 fee for youth who have entered fair but did not enroll before July 5th (\$80.00 total) First year member enrollment fees will remain \$15 year round.



How can we help youth become the best version of themselves?

INDEPENDENCE can be seen in the 4-H program when members see how their 4-H experiences can shape their future life choices. To go a step further, their vision then transitions into actual future participation. For true INDEPENDENCE youth must develop a sense of influence over their lives, exercising their potential to become self-directing adults.

INDEPENDENCE IS ACHIEVED WHEN YOUTH SEE THEMSELVES AS ACTIVE PARTICIPANTS IN THE FUTURE. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Youth have something to look forward to in the program, in a sense there is a next step. Members can look forward to being leaders in 4-H or other organizations.
- Youth have the chance to try out new things in a safe environment.
- Youth can learn skills in their projects that help them choose a career path.
- Youth set goals and make plans for the upcoming year or years.

WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE IN A 4-H EXPERIENCE?

• Adults are helping and encouraging youth to set long term goals 5–10 years in the future that are challenging and achievable. Then help them to experience opportunities to realize some of those goals through the 4–H program.

• Youth are given the opportunity to develop ideas and then see them to completion over time.






