



- Fill in the required fields (you can use your same email and password from 4HOnline).






- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).

What is quality assurance?

Youth Quality Assurance (YQA) teaches youth how to give the best care for their livestock in order to produce a high quality product for consumers. This is learned through understanding the importance proper nutrition, housing, identification, handling, carcass quality, health care, withdrawal times, and record keeping.

All youth planning to sell a market project must complete YQA each year. Below is a list of dates for all nutrition and YQA classes that will be offered this year.

This is NOT a Junior Livestock Sale Committee requirement.

How do I meet my requirements?

- Take one of the many classes offered.
- Come to a livestock nutrition and/or selection workshop
- Participate in a state wide zoom about livestock. Please check with us to make sure it meets the requirements.
- Take a test about quality assurance.
- Take an online course at yqca.org.



If members have gone through Pork check Off (PQA) or have completed the Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) or have another quality assurance certification, that will meet your requirements.

If you choose to take another quality assurance course, please send us a copy of your certificate.

How often do I need quality assurance?

Members are required to take quality assurance at each age level. The first year you show a market animal take level 1. Then when you are an intermediate take level 2. When you are a senor take level 3. If you start as a senior, take one level a year until complete.

If you are unsure which levels you have completed, or if you need quality assurance, please contact our office.

Option to test

If you would prefer to test out of YQA, an age and species appropriate test may be taken at either extension office. Youth must score an 80% or higher, and can retake the test (on a different day) as many times as they would like. Members scoring 100% (on the senior level test) will no longer need to complete YQA in future years. Junior and intermediates scoring 100% will not need to complete YQA again until they reach a new age level. Here is a study guide for the tests!



As of April 8, 2022, HPAI has been detected in commercial and backyard poultry and game bird operations in half of the states in the U.S., including five premises within Wyoming. Due to the increased risk of HPAI spread within Wyoming poultry, game bird, and wild bird populations, increased biosecurity is of the utmost importance.

No live bird events until further notice or at least, August 17th

Anyone involved with poultry production from the small backyard to the large commercial producer should review their biosecurity activities to assure the health of their birds. APHIS has materials about biosecurity, including videos, checklists, and a toolkit available at https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/ourfocus/animalhealth/animal-disease-information/avian/defend-the-flock-program/dtf-resources/dtf-resources.

If HPAI is diagnosed in WY, the disease will most likely be introduced via migratory waterfowl. Please encourage anyone with poultry to do the following:

· avoid exposure to wild waterfowl and their manure

· watch carefully for signs of influenza in poultry, including nasal discharge, swollen eyelids, sudden death, diarrhea

report any illness or unexplained deaths in birds, especially in wild waterfowl or domestic poultry, to the following:



Los Leaders Connection

How can we help youth become the best version of themselves?

GENEROSITY is the willingness to give and share of one's time and/or resources. GENEROSITY is done without an expectation that the gift or act will be returned. GENEROSITY in the 4-H program can take many different forms. GENEROSITY is the act of giving, serving, or helping. We feel good about ourselves when we do something to make the lives of others easier. There are different types of giving; we can give of our time, talents, or give financially In 4-H we promote generosity through service-learning. Service-learning includes helping others and learning. The intent is that the 4-H members who are doing the service will benefit along with the person they are serving. Service-learning provides youth with the opportunity to feel that their lives have meaning and purpose. It is a chance for youth to connect with their communities and learn how to give back to others. Service is more than a product; it is a process that provides developmental opportunities for 4-H members.

GENEROSITY IS THE OPPORTUNITY TO VALUE AND PRACTICE SERVICE TO OTHERS. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

Young people need to feel their lives have meaning and purpose.

- Generosity or service includes the development of values like compassion, tolerance, the ability to consider others' perspectives, and problem-solving skills.
- Generosity in the form of service-learning is teaching and learning strategies that involve meaningful community service with time to reflect.
- Youth are learning what it means to be a good citizen and how being a good citizen can strengthen a community.

WHAT DOES THIS LOOK LIKE IN A 4-H EXPERIENCE?

- Youth are excited about serving others and helping their community.
- Adults help youth to identify community needs and then youth design solutions to help meet those needs.
- Youth are involved in all stages of the service project. Youth help to plan, design, implement, manage, and evaluate the service. It is not planned by the adults for the youth to participate in.


