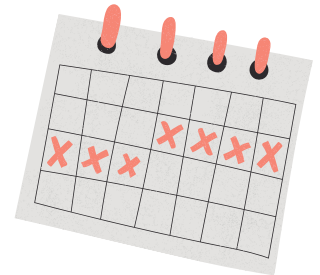

- Fashion Revue:** June 1st

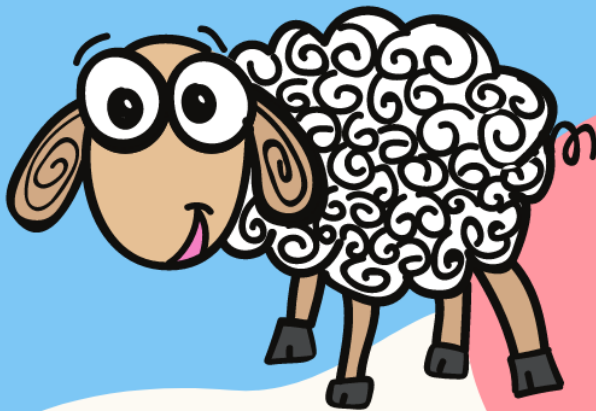

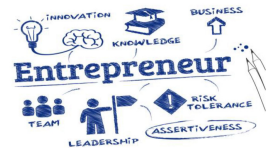

WHAT WILL I LEARN DURING THE SERIES?

- Phase One of the Rocky Mountain Youth Entrepreneur Series will assist youth in establishing a business plan, creating a management proposal, forming a vision for their business (to include a Mission Statement/Vision Statement) and work with youth to analyze the market.
- Phase Two of the series will include lessons on business competition, marketing, operation and financial plans and business contingency plans. To complete the series, youth will pitch and present their completed Business Plan to a panel of business professionals for feedback and advice.
