

Washakie County 4-H Council Meeting Minutes  
October 6, 2025

Cindy called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m. Jessica led the Pledge of Allegiance, Cindy led the 4-H Pledge. Michelle moved, Jessica seconded to defer approval of the Secretary's Report until the next meeting. The motion carried.

Tera presented the Treasurer's Report and noted the expenses for 4-H camp are higher than usual because they are paying for two years at once. The bill for the previous year did not come until 2025, so both are set to be paid in one fiscal year. Jessica moved, Emily seconded to pay the larger bill and approve the Treasurer's Report as read. The motion carried.

Amber reported that the South Flat Club recently made a food bank donation for community service and implemented a gratitude officer to help write thank you notes every month.

Emily and Michelle reported that the Renegades Club will be selling butter braids and will fix rabbit and chicken pens at the fairgrounds for community service. They currently do an attendance award.

Cindy reported that Roadrunners heard a presentation on childhood cancer last month and made a donation to help support childhood cancer for community service. They hope to elect officers in October and will also look into implementing a gratitude officer.

Amber reported that the fairboard will meet next month to discuss amending the required weight for hogs at county fair. She said there was good participation for the homecoming float/parade last month, and she explained all the activities for 4-H week. She said she would like to design some 4-H apparel for adults and kids to have the opportunity to purchase. The group agreed that would be a nice way for everyone to support 4-H. Amber said there are a few record books left to judge, and Achievement Night is set for November 13<sup>th</sup> in Ten Sleep. Set up will be at 4 that day.

Cindy moved to table officer elections until next month. Michelle seconded, and the motion carried.

Amber reminded council members that nominations for Achievement Night are due October 10, and club secretary, historian and treasurer books are due October 15. Cloverbuds will meet October 21, and Amber is still collecting goods made by members to sell in the office.
